





Many successful careers start with an apprenticeship. On completion, 90% of apprentices stay in employment with 71% staying with the same employer.

WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

An apprenticeship is a real job with training which allows young people to earn while they learn, whilst gaining a nationally recognised qualification.

APPRENTICESHIPS ARE FOR PEOPLE:

- Who want to learn practically, in the workplace
- Who are keen to start working towards a career, yet want to continue gaining qualifications, sometimes to degree level
- Who are keen to be earning whilst learning

LEVELS OF APPRENTICESHIPS:

- Level 2 Apprenticeship
- Level 3 Advanced Apprenticeship
- Higher Apprenticeship (Foundation Degree, HND, Degree)
- Degree Apprenticeships (Degree, Masters Degree)
